FAFSA Tips for Advising Students

1. Students may list up to 10 schools on their FAFSA. They should list any school they are interested in applying to (up to 10).
2. Students need to make sure they file with their correct Social Security number.
3. Both the student and one of their parents (if they are dependent) each need an FSA ID username and password. These can be created at fsaid.ed.gov.
4. The FAFSA is free! Students should file their FAFSA at www.fafsa.gov. If they are ever asked for a credit card, they are at the wrong site and need to re-enter the correct URL in their browser.
5. Link to the PA State Grant Form from the FAFSA Confirmation page to apply for a PA State Grant.
